# greetings

*from the Executive Director and Board of Trustees Chair*

Gravatt Camp and Conference Center is fortunately positioned in a place of growth and opportunity as we celebrate our 75th anniversary. It wasn't all that long ago that Gravatt faced a time of uncertainty about its future. We are at a juncture where camp sessions are filling faster than ever before and we are experiencing a year-over-year increase in camper registration. Our year-round programming and overnight conference group business are robust. We recently overhauled our environmental education program with UP Outdoors, and we offer a variety of unique programs that meet curriculum requirements of elementary through high school grades.

Gravatt is addressing larger capital repairs and evaluating our business model, focusing on both large and small things to cumulatively make Gravatt a stronger organization to better serve the needs and interests of campers and conference guests.

It is important to note that as a nonprofit, Gravatt's need is still great. We prioritize keeping camp and conference costs affordable; in fact, we are one of the most affordable overnight camps in the Southeast. Gravatt doesn't always offer the shiniest and newest outdoor amenities, though we continually strive to add new features for our camp and conference annually. Examples include three new high rope elements, the centipedes, the vertical playpen, and giant swing and on the conference side, we have added a large outdoor meeting space.

This year, key capital improvements and repairs began largely in response to the Winter 2023 freeze. As a result, we spent more than \$30,000 on the camp side with an additional \$5,000 on the conference side, in response to the freeze to address a significant amount of damage. However, this provided us the opportunity to make improvements on aging plumbing and continue working on the efficiency of water systems, and we now have updated and accurate utility records. Total repairs and maintenance performed on the Gravatt facilities totaled \$110,000 this year.

Research indicates that post-COVID pandemic children and youth face a multitude of challenges relating to social skills, emotional, and behavioral changes. Now more

than ever before, we receive feedback from camper families about the importance of Gravatt to their campers. They value our focus on fostering a positive and inclusive experience for all of our campers in an environment where each camper feels respected, loved, and valued. Gravatt's summer camp program positively impacts the lives of countless children and youth, ultimately helping to transform them into thriving adults. With permission, I share with you a very recent post from a camper's social media page that demonstrates the lifelong impact Gravatt can make on our campers:

"This is a late post but I want to say thank you for this summer and for every summer. I just turned 15 and I'm slowly growing up but I'm becoming the person I want to be. I'm scared for what the future has waiting for me but I know if I think of the love that camp has shown me I will be ready. Thank you Gravatt and all the people who shown me love I haven't always been the best but you were still there for me. I will show the world the love you have shown me and someday be the person who I strive to be." - **Loudon Smith**

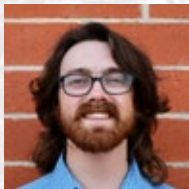

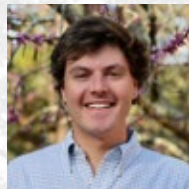

# facilities

## *Upgrades and infrastructure*

As a result of the Christmas freeze of 2022, Gravatt's maintenance and facilities staff focused a lot of time and resources on our water systems. During that winter event, Gravatt experienced damaged plumbing and water system damages in eight different locations primarily on the camp side of the property. However, we turned this into an opportunity to make additional improvements to the dated plumbing and water systems.

Gravatt facility staff, along with assistance from contractors and consultants, installed new plumbing, pipes, and water valves. A consultant assisted Gravatt in locating and inspecting all main water valves and creating a detailed utility map with water pipes and valves of that area. Upgrades were also made to the boys bathhouse plumbing.

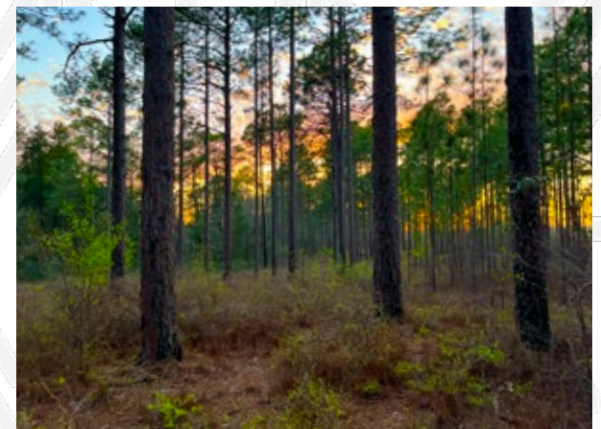
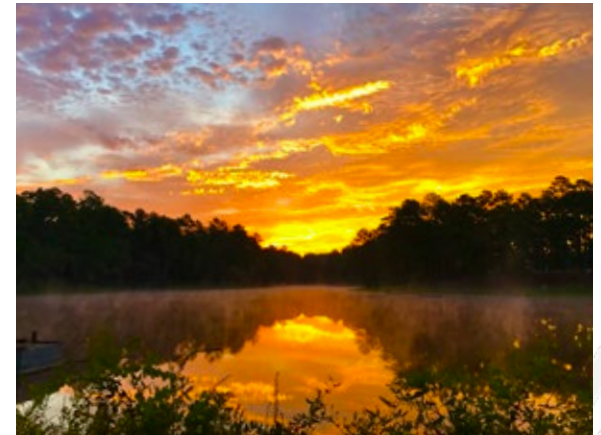
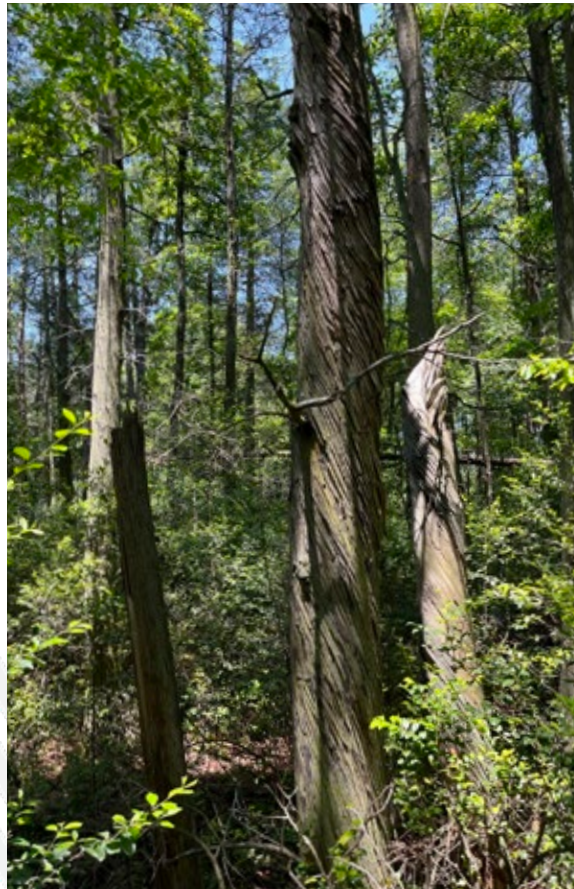




# environmental stewardship

## *Environmental Diversity Forestry Management*

The Longleaf Pine Savanna is a critically endangered ecosystem. Originally comprising 90 million acres in the American Southeast, it has been decimated down to a mere 3 million acres. A habitat loss of 97%. How lucky are we at Gravatt to have healthy stands of Longleaf Pines. In addition to the Longleaf Pine ecosystem, we are looking into methods to manage our Atlantic White Cedar Ecosystem and our stands of Mixed Hardwood Forests. The Atlantic White Cedar bog is another critically endangered ecosystem that calls Gravatt home. These bog environments are extremely efficient at capturing and storing carbon out of the atmosphere to be recycled into the soil creating a rich peat environment. With the use of prescribed fire and selective cutting, we are trying restore these ecosystems to what they once resembled in order to attract certain animal species that once roamed these environments. We hope our efforts will qualify Gravatt to be a release site for the endangered Red Cockaded Woodpecker through the SC Forestry Commission's Safe Harbor Program.

# environmental stewardship

## *Forestry Management and Sustainability*

Gravatt's Forestry Management Plan is an evolving plan, with a long term goal of maintaining and restoring our 280+ acres to its natural and native habitat and ecosystem. Our Forestry Management plan and techniques also serve as a building block for Gravatt's UP Outdoors curriculum by teaching about what we do to improve our environment.

We have two management plans, one is developed by a private consultant and the other by the South Carolina Forestry Commission. Each plan addresses different goals for our forestry management. Our primary techniques used are prescribed fire and selective thinning of our forests. Other techniques include planting of native plants, discing the forest floor, but fire and thinning have the most impact on reaching our primary goal is to create an environment to promote the existence and health of native species of wildlife, plants, and trees. By using prescribed fire and selective harvesting we create an environment for wildlife and plants to thrive naturally.

## *Gravatt Environmental Education*

Program Director, Evan Mikula uses the land we care for to educate children and young adults through our Gravatt Environmental Education Program. The GEEP program allows students to engage in active learning using all their senses - seeing, touching, feeling, and smelling the world around them. With our mission as a guiding frame, we have renewed our fervor and are working to develop the Upland Pine Outdoor and Adventure Center at Gravatt which will be geared toward school groups. UP Outdoors, as it will be called, will incorporate many things familiar at Gravatt along with new curriculum and activities. UP Outdoors will be fully operational and available in the fall of 2024.

Evan Mikula also leads campers to explore the outdoors away from Gravatt. The Gravatt Explorers program is open to campers who are rising 10th graders through rising college freshmen. Gravatt Explorers experience two exciting outdoor excursions: a backpacking trip to Shining Rock Wilderness Area in Pisgah National Forest located near Brevard, NC and a canoe trip down the Broad River in Columbia to make camp at Congaree National Park. This program engages young people in adventures and life lessons while creating lifelong memories.

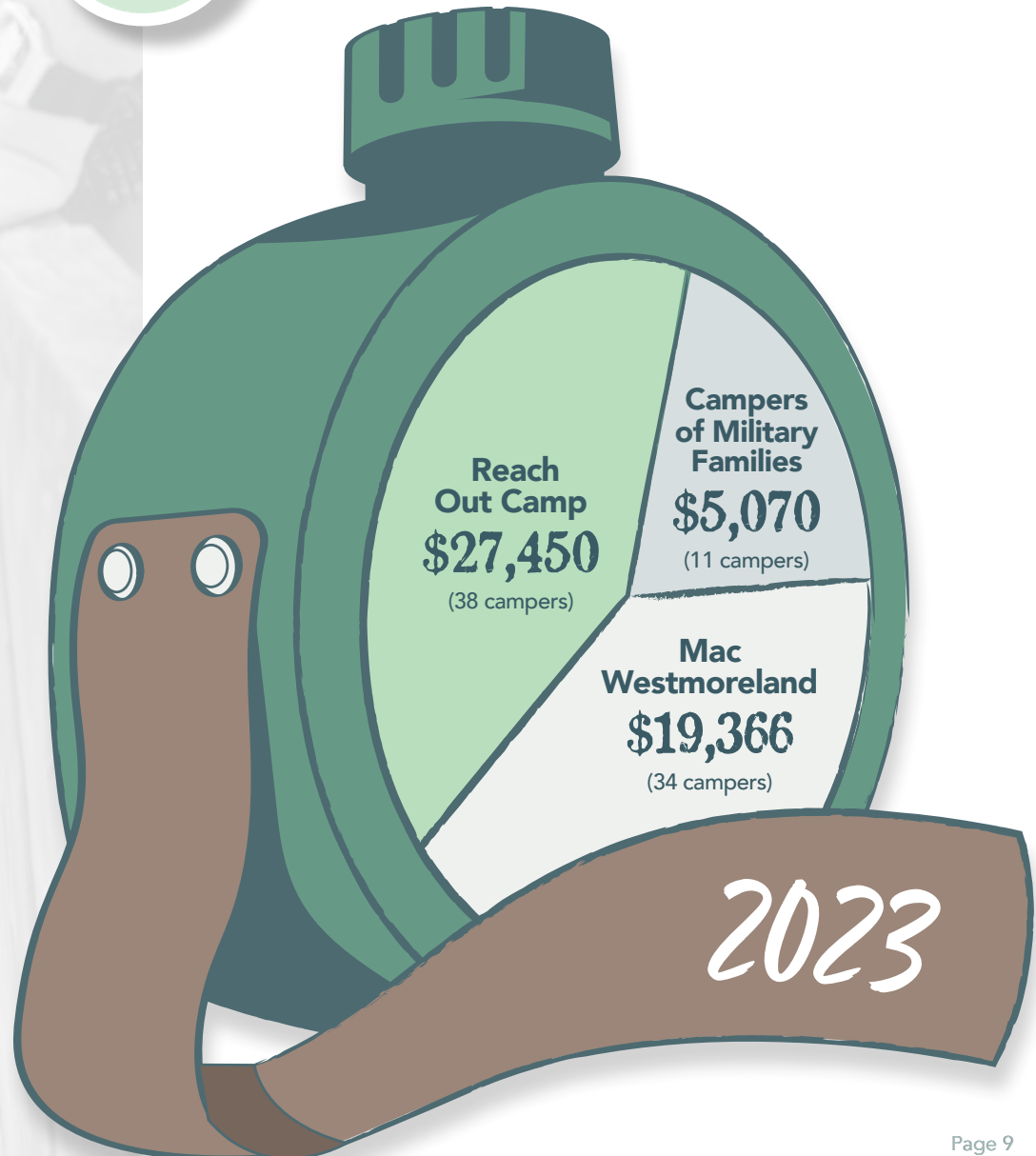

## *New Camp Pavilion*

It has been more than 20 years since Gravatt has undertaken a project the scale of the camp pavilion. During that time, much has changed with the design, bidding and permitting process which has led to a longer timeline for this project than originally planned. Having expanded the current camp pavilion twice, the picture below shows how full the space can get during camp session. Because the pavilion also serves as an emergency shelter during Gravatt's summer camp sessions and the primary gathering space for evening activities requiring lighting and electricity, construction timing is critical to ensure the project is complete for the start of the new camp session. In some cases original plans need to be adapted to accommodate larger infrastructure requirements. The new pavilion will also provide additional space for year-round groups, a camp mailroom, restrooms, and a much needed Gravatt store.

Thank you to the generous architect services of Clint Burdett of B Design for the new pavilion concept and plans. The general contractor will be announced very soon and donor opportunities will be unveiled.
